
The first ever elections for Police and Crime **Commissioners will take place on 15th November 2012**

- Set local policing priorities in a Police and Crime Plan
- · Set the annual force budget and council tax precept
- Appoint the Chief Constable in charge of operational policing
- · Investigate complaints against the Chief Constable and monitor complaints against staff and officers
- Consult and involve the public and collaborate with other forces and agencies including the council, the probation service and the courts
